FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

Monday, May 19, 2024 6:30 pm Fellowship Hall

Attendees: Karen Kleinwort, Dillon Denter, Vicki Schweiger, Jaci Gosse, Lois Johnson, April Dean, Joi Bishop, Patty Starkson, & Pastor Jes Bakken Busch

Absent: Lisa Wolf

Monthly meeting called to order by President Karen Kleinwort. Council's Covenant of Conduct read by all

Devotions on making best use of our resources led by Pastor Jes.

The *Treasurer's Report* was supplied by Mindy Schaefer but she was not able to attend this meeting.

See attached financial reports; Mindy noted that expenses were higher than usual due to paying for March snow removal, payment for employment time owed to Nadine & for a substitute organist. Discussion of member's donations being marked for Dedicated Funds rather than the General Fund.

Mindy also noted that the Mission Investment Fund \$50,000 1-Yr Term Deposit will mature 6-2-2024. She estimates the balance will be \$52,542 at maturity. MIF is offering a ?-month Term at 5.05% APY. Mindy recommends the Council approve reinvesting the \$50,000 amount in the 5.05% APY 7-month Term. The \$2,542 income gained will go to the General Fund. Motion to reinvest \$50,000 in MIF 5.05% APY 7-month Term by Jaci/April; Motion Carried Unanimously.

Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report by Lyn/Dillon. Discussion continued on expenses & income transactions for April 2024. Council shares concern of the decrease in giving to the General Fund but understands the giving to Dedicated Funds shows members have missions they want to support. Council will continue to monitor & watch for areas of financial operations that can be improved. **Motion Carried unanimously.**

Secretary's Report presented by Vicki Schweiger

Council meeting April 8, 2024 minutes reviewed; Discussion of including Pastor Jes as Council & not as Staff Member. Requested to use the term "Attendees" rather than "Council Members Present" & "Staff Present". Discussion of the Continuing Pastoral Education Unused Balance note that "Council will review at next meeting." Secretary notes were reviewed that stated Mindy would check into how this would alter employment taxes & report back to Council. Will correct minutes to reflect "Council to review at a future meeting." Motion to approve 4-8-2024 Council Minutes with correction to "Attendees" & "Review CPE at future Council meeting", by Lyn/Jaci.

Discussion of ways to share information with congregation members. Suggestions to have more details included in the meeting minutes, be sure the minutes in the record book have been approved by Council & include any reports that should be attached; to include the full Council minutes with financial reports to the newsletter; including a Council meeting summary to the newsletter; having the Council President create a church email account for members to directly communicate with Council. This will be discussed more as part of the Listening Sessions Report. Karen will be setting up an email account as soon as possible & will share that information with Carol to communicate to members. **Motion Carried unanimously.**

Pastor's Report presented by Pastor Jes

See attached submitted report of monthly activity. It was suggested the Faith Lutheran Church activities be listed before the professional or continuing education activities. Pastor Jes reviewed the usual schedule of home visits to members unable to attend service visits to Circle Drive Manor or the Fairview Care Center.

Ministry Team Reports:

- Education, Patty 4-15-24 mtg Majority of the meeting was reviewing plans for ROAR VBS from June 10th-13th, plans for supper, lessons, crafts & songs were discussed. Sunday School ended 4-28 for the year. Next meeting 5-20-24 @ 6:30 pm.
- Outreach, Lisa May Service Sunday flower pots were delivered & Triton staff was very happy with them. More volunteers are needed to pack the Faith Pantry bags each month. Pastor Jess to contact Kathy @ Synod office to research Global outreach opportunities to be discussed at a future meeting. Next meeting is scheduled for 5-20-24 @ 5:30 pm.
- Personnel, Lois Employee reviews were completed for 2 employees, the other will be done in May. The Open Music Director position will be discussed later in this meeting.
- Properties, April No meeting was held due to schedule conflicts but via email exchanges were made to discuss the need for spring cleanup inside & outside the church. Areas they have identified as needing to be done include landscaping, the shed, cupboards in the kitchen & other storage areas. A member has volunteered the paint for the Fellowship Hall bathrooms to be painted. Committee requested Council input on scheduling the event & any other items/areas to be added to list. Council agreed that a date & time should be set for all to attend & help rather than individual times. This will create an opportunity for fellowship for those that participate.

Stewardship, Dillon - No Report

Worship, Arts & Music (WAM), Lyn - Altar Guild met to plan duties; music team has been working on picking songs for service; planning to work on changing some interior decor or pictures to other items the church has; early planning for an outdoor service during the summer.

Old Business:

Committee Descriptions, Purpose, Function - Discussion tabled to a future meeting; committees should be discussing at monthly meetings.

New Business:

Donation from Sue Anderson, in memory of her father. No discussion needed; the family has decided on an alternate recipient.

Properties Feedback Request - Already discussed during Ministry Team Reports.

Director of Music & Worship Proposal - Karen presented the employment agreement worked on between Personnel Chair Jodi Steen, Pastor Jes & Levi Livingood. It is a 1-year agreement to be reviewed before year 2. The employment proposal includes Duties & Responsibilities as the Faith Lutheran Church Director of Music & Worship, 1st Year Goals & Salary. Discussion on the pay & hours to be worked. It was noted that weddings & funerals are not part of the agreement, as that is covered as part of the event cost to the family. Council members were agreeable to all items except the use of a paid substitute for the 1 Sunday per month that Levi has requested to not be present. It would be preferred to have him prerecord the music. Motion to approve the employment agreement between Faith Lutheran Church and Levi Livingood for the position of Director of Music and Worship per the presented 1-year proposal, with the condition of recorded music instead of a substitute for the 1 Sunday per month he is not working, made by Joi/April. Motion carried unanimously.

Listening Session Report Review:

Council members had received a copy of the Listening Report with this meeting's agenda. Discussion on the importance to share with the congregation what has been heard, what has been done already, what can be done soon & what to work on in the future. Because the report is long & detailed, Jaci offered to create a shorter summary of hot points to be sent to the congregation via email. The full unedited report will be available at the church for those that want to read what was provided to Council. It was agreed that an action plan needs to be created to address future items to work on & the Executive Team will create this with assistance provided by other Council members.

One point of the report that was discussed are the questions concerning Pastor's vacation time. Vacation time is part of the call contract approved by the Council but members may not be aware of the amount of time allowed. Just as with any other employment, there is also time off for continuing education opportunities, illness and unexpected family events. As an employer, Faith Lutheran cannot require her to explain to the congregation why she is not present on Sunday, but some Council members feel it would be helpful if she could say something about her absence.

Pastor Jes explained to the Council that the cost of the listening session project was paid by Thrivent dollars from the Thrivent members of the congregation. No monies were needed from Faith Lutheran Church's general fund or dedicated funds. Council is thankful for the funding of this project from these members.

Meeting scheduled for Tuesday, May 21st at 6 pm for the Executive Team & any others to review the summary report before it is emailed out to the congregation.

Next Council meeting was rescheduled to Monday, June 17th at 6:30 pm due to VBS.

Motion to Adjourn by Lois/Joi at 8:45 pm. Carried unanimously.

Meeting ended by sharing the Lord's Prayer.

Mini Sermon

Matthew 28:19-20 "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
